**Program: Dr. Mary Brady** gave an informative and insightful presentation on an important topic; end of life care. She gave useful resources on many Person centered care alternatives to the hospital such as Hospice and Compassionate Care where volunteers help the family of the ill focus on the meaningfulness of their life and to continue to do meaningful acts rather than let the deterioration of life due to illness end all joyful activities. Dr. Brady also reminded us of the importance in having a healthcare proxy and living will for us and those we love. There is always a need for compassionate care volunteers and training is done twice per year over 8x 3hour classes which are usually life changing for the students as well as those they care for.
