What a pleasant afternoon to have our meeting in the **Canandaigua Yacht Club** and hear of its 75 Year Anniv. and its 119 years of existence when it was started by Canandaigua resident **Peter Layton**. Eight original members met once a month in June, July, and August to race their boats. In 1935, when the club was incorporated, members met on Wednesday Afternoon, a normal city /closed shop day to race Snipes, then later Stars, and 14ft dingys. Snipes moved well in light air and did not capsize in strong winds. Originally club was on the east side of the Lake until 1939 when the Beechers from the Beecher tract put up their home for sale.
